Election procedures for caucus meetings

- The BCFED Executive Council members representing Workers with Disabilities, Racialized Workers, Indigenous Workers and 2SLGBTQIA+ Workers shall be elected in caucus meetings.
- 2. Nominations will be made from the floor, no seconder is required. Individuals will then be asked if they accept the nomination. (We understand the Indigenous Workers Caucus may have its own process.)
- 3. Any candidate for the BCFED Executive Council representing *one of these caucuses* must:
 - be a self-identifying member of the caucus;
 - be a member of an affiliated union;
 - be a delegate to the 2022 BCFED Convention; and
 - have a signed form indicating the endorsement of their affiliate.
- 4. Candidates will be offered two (2) minutes to speak to their interest in the position. The two minutes will begin after the delegate has finished introducing themself.
- 5. Voting will be conducted by secret ballot or a culturally appropriate decision-making model based on the will of the caucus.
- 6. If there is only one candidate, they will be acclaimed.
- 7. In the case of a secret ballot vote, a majority of votes cast are required before a candidate is declared elected. Second and subsequent ballots shall be taken if necessary to obtain a majority. On the second and subsequent ballots the candidate receiving the lowest number of votes in the previous ballot shall be dropped. If there is only one candidate, they will be acclaimed to the position.
